Nextdoor, Inc. is the company that provides the specific web site tied to only the addresses in the defined neighborhood—they do this for over 35,000 neighborhoods in the U.S. Only people who live in the specific neighborhood (ours is the 653 households in the New Albany Links development) can join so there are no outside interests or advertising groups to interfere. Nextdoor uses some specific information to verify that you live at the address in the "Nextdoor New Albany Links" neighborhood and does not save or share any information used for verification. My wife Christy's sister and husband have belonged to a Nextdoor neighborhood

web site in Ft. Lauderdale for a couple of years—they like it and find it very useful. It's not a scam and we haven't been bombarded with spam e-mails or advertising. DCHA resident and newly elected president of the New Albany Links Master Homeowners Association Nelson Merrill invited me and many others to join the web site and, as of today, there are 132 members participating representing 103 households. 


She recently attended a sporting event of one of her grandchildren and enjoyed this new experience.
