The recent heavy rains highlighted an on-going problem affecting resi-

dents on Keesee Circle. There is a retention pond behind the clubhouse that is supposed to catch the runoff from heavy rains and direct it safely away. That hasn't been working successfully causing some flooding issues for some residents. Recently during a heavy rain, the New Albany inspector was able to witness the problem. Action to make corrections is expected but no dates have been announced.
