Semi-Annual Meeting Highlights

Dave Ewing, representing the NAL Master Homeowners Association, described the work being done to repair and maintain the "gateway" areas at the four entrances into New Albany Links at the DCHA semi-annual meeting on May 5. Our association is responsible for maintaining the gateway at Bevelhymer and New Albany Road East. That responsibility was negotiated by the DCHA board and the developer at the time the master association was preparing to be transferred to residents. Our residents pay \$200 less for the annual master association fee saving our residents about \$20,000 per year. The cost to replace shrubs, repair/paint fencing and repair brickwork is estimated to be \$11,000 for our gateway, a cost that is not annually recurring.

Treasurer Tom Weiss expects the cost will be covered through the association's general fund and is not expected to cause an increase in the monthly fee. All residents are current with monthly fees and snow removal fees were less than previous years.

Bob Youngs reported on clubhouse and pool activities. The clubhouse parking lot will be sealed and re-lined. The board is obtaining estimates to repair the sagging concrete section outside the clubhouse back door. Major maintenance and replacement activities are planned by the board with the assistance of experts who prepare a Reserve Study every

five years to review conditions and estimate costs. The current 2012 plan will be updated in 2017.

Clubhouse committee member Janis Nelson reported that the committee is investigating making improvements to the clubhouse interior—furnishings, window treatments, and accessories--noting that they had largely not changed, except for new carpet, for 14 years. They consulted an interior designer who made a number of suggestions that would total \$13,000. She said there were many opportunities to make changes and asked for residents to make comments and suggestions for how our clubhouse should be used-should we keep the status quo as a "party house" or make it more of an extension of our living rooms? No specific proposal was made at the meeting.

The board has not budgeted such expenses this year and, in light of other pending expenses, is not sure if any funds are available. The board's intent is not to raise monthly fees for this project but to see what may be possible over time. Board members have heard from a number of residents and would like to hear from more. There is new construction on Route 62 north of Smiths Mill Road which includes a Hampton Inn, a Turkey Hill gas station with Mini-mart, and a Dairy Queen. A Taco Bell is under construction next to Huntington Bank on Central college and New Albany Road East.

2015 Street Maintenance Program

The City of New Albany announced the 2015 street maintenance program. Many residential streets will be repaved, rejuvenated or crack sealed this summer and autumn.

Specifically for the Dominion Club, Dean Farm Road and Keesee Circle will be resurfaced and New Albany Road East will have crack seal and rejuvenating agent applied. Bevelhymer will be resurfaced from Central College north to the city line. The city will notify residents prior to the activity.


According to Brian Walkenspaw, city engineering technician, repaving involves removing the top 1.5 inches of asphalt and replacing it with 1.5 inches of new asphalt pavement.

Crack sealing is a rubber-asphalt hotpoured material with sufficient elasticity to withstand horizontal crack movements. Best for placement in working cracks on roads. Optimum crack width range: 1/8" to 3/4" inch. The City of New Albany uses a trackless material that is does not stick to tires. Crack sealing helps to preserve cracks from rain/snow permeability.

ALBADA ABLISHED IN

Asphalt rejuvenator is used on newly constructed pavements, it will improve the durability characteristics of the asphalt pavement mix, by replacing asphalt liquid components lost to the heat of production while providing an in-depth seal to reduce permeability by rain/snow.
